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CASE STUDY #2

CE

DOB: 8/14/48

Gender: Female

Occupation: ordained minister

CE had bilateral mastectomies in 11/2000 and was treated with chemo and radiation six times. Surgery for her L breast took a total of three surgeries to completely remove all the cancer. She was left with very little tissue on the left side which is extremely tight as well as very tight scar tissue. The radiation also caused her chest, mostly in the area of her sternum to be discolored and redish. She has had laser treatment for the discoloration which has been reduced by half.

Her treatment consists of opening her clavicles, thoracic duct, deep abdominal nodes and L inguinal nodes and retraining her lymph to move from the L arm to other possible pathways....She has mild Lymphedema of her L arm with a 'pocket' of lymph below her axillary and medial. She maps to her L inguinals and across her back to her R axillary.

Since treating CE, her scar tissue has softened significantly and she says she can breath deeper. Her 'pocket' of lymph no longer bothers her. Because of travel, CE receives lymphatic drainage every 4-8 weeks.
