

CranioSacral Therapy: When and Where to Use It

The past 20 years have brought widespread recognition of CranioSacral Therapy as an efficacious modality in many different circumstances. This understanding occurred first in the public sphere, then spread through the healthcare professions with little regard for interdisciplinary boundaries.

The driving force behind this heightened recognition is twofold. First, it's based on the beneficial results experienced by CranioSacral Therapy recipients. Second, most practitioners thoroughly enjoy doing the work. They appreciate being part of a process that helps move their patients along individual pathways to bodymind-spirit integration — and better health.

Yet along with the recognition have come many questions about the use of CranioSacral Therapy. The self-healing mechanisms integral to every living system are largely disregarded. At best they're minimally honored by the popular "fix it" approach. Drugs and surgery are routinely used in invasive, often toxic and detrimental ways. They do not offer the body's wonderfully ingenious natural processes the opportunity to function optimally, if at all.

Competent CranioSacral Therapists search for obstacles and circumstances that compromise these inherent self-corrective processes. The practitioners then focus on removing the obstacles and modifying the circumstances to allow the body to do its work. The practitioner simply supports the body so it can continue to correct health-destructive problems.

Given that CranioSacral Therapy facilitates each individual's healing abilities, it seems reasonable that the practitioner would be a welcome addition to the conventional Western approach. Indeed, I'm quite comfortable saying CranioSacral Therapy is efficacious for all patients being treated by conventional practitioners.

European Expert Brings Energy Medicine Techniques to the U.S.

Three-Day Course Teaches How to Use Subtle Energy as a Therapeutic Instrument

Norway's Inya L'Orange, a physical therapist who helped pioneer Europe's natural-childbirth movement in the 1970s, will teach two upcoming classes in the U.S. Subtle Energy as a Therapeutic Instrument I (SETI) is scheduled for Oct. 16-18 in Palm Beach, Fla., and Oct. 22-24, 1999, in Portland, Oreg.

The goal of SETI, according to Inya, is not only to teach practitioners how to tap into the human energy field. "We also teach them very specific techniques that allow them to put that energy to use as a therapeutic agent." The therapists then learn to read the information the body sends out to better correct energy blockages or "shadows" that are impeding health.

Course topics include subtle energies in the brain and spinal cord, balancing magnetic and gravity fields, the four layers of etheric and psychic streams, etheric lymph massage to dissolve memory blocks, prahna energy, the art of grounding, and how to blend energy work with modalities such as CranioSacral Therapy. Here's a sample of a brief Feldenkrais Method movement sequence that can help release tension from the jaw.

Start by lying quietly on your back. Support your knees with a pillow or bolster if you wish. Sense your contact with the floor.

- 1. Slowly look up and down, scanning your visual field. Notice the tendency of your eyes to move erratically. See if you can allow that movement to become smoother. Close your eyes and rest.
- 2. Slowly open and close your mouth. Do not strain. Sense the quality of the movement. Notice if there are "glitches" or difficulties with jerking motions. Again, see if you can allow the movement to become smooth.
- 3. Continue steps 1 and 2 by looking down as you open your mouth, then looking up as you close your mouth. Allow both movements to become smooth and easy.
- 4. Look up as you open your mouth, then look down as you close your mouth. This may be a more difficult movement. Be patient with yourself.
- 5. Repeat step 3. Are the movements easier now?
- 6. Repeat step 2. Has the quality of the movement changed?

You may be surprised at the changes you experience after such a deceptively simple exercise. Yet make no mistake about it, this innovative technique is but one of hundreds of exercises that subtly reprogram your brain to bring you to a greater level of function and awareness.
